Costs and Externalities

- Doing interesting things in HTML is hard, but...
 - Devs know HTML
 - Systems produce HTML
 - Search engines *only* understand HTML
- Many apps can't be attempted with HTML alone
 - Almost: 2D vectors, offline/storage, Comet
 - No chance: Audio, video, 3D, image transforms

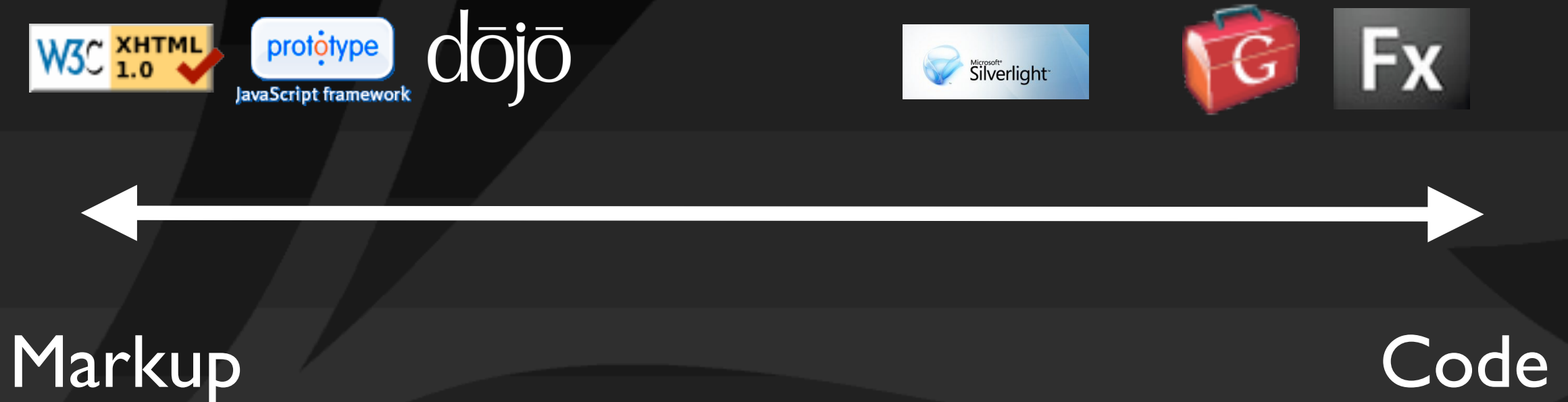

Disambiguation: 2 Kind of “Suck”

- Can't begin to handle the problem
 - No native capability

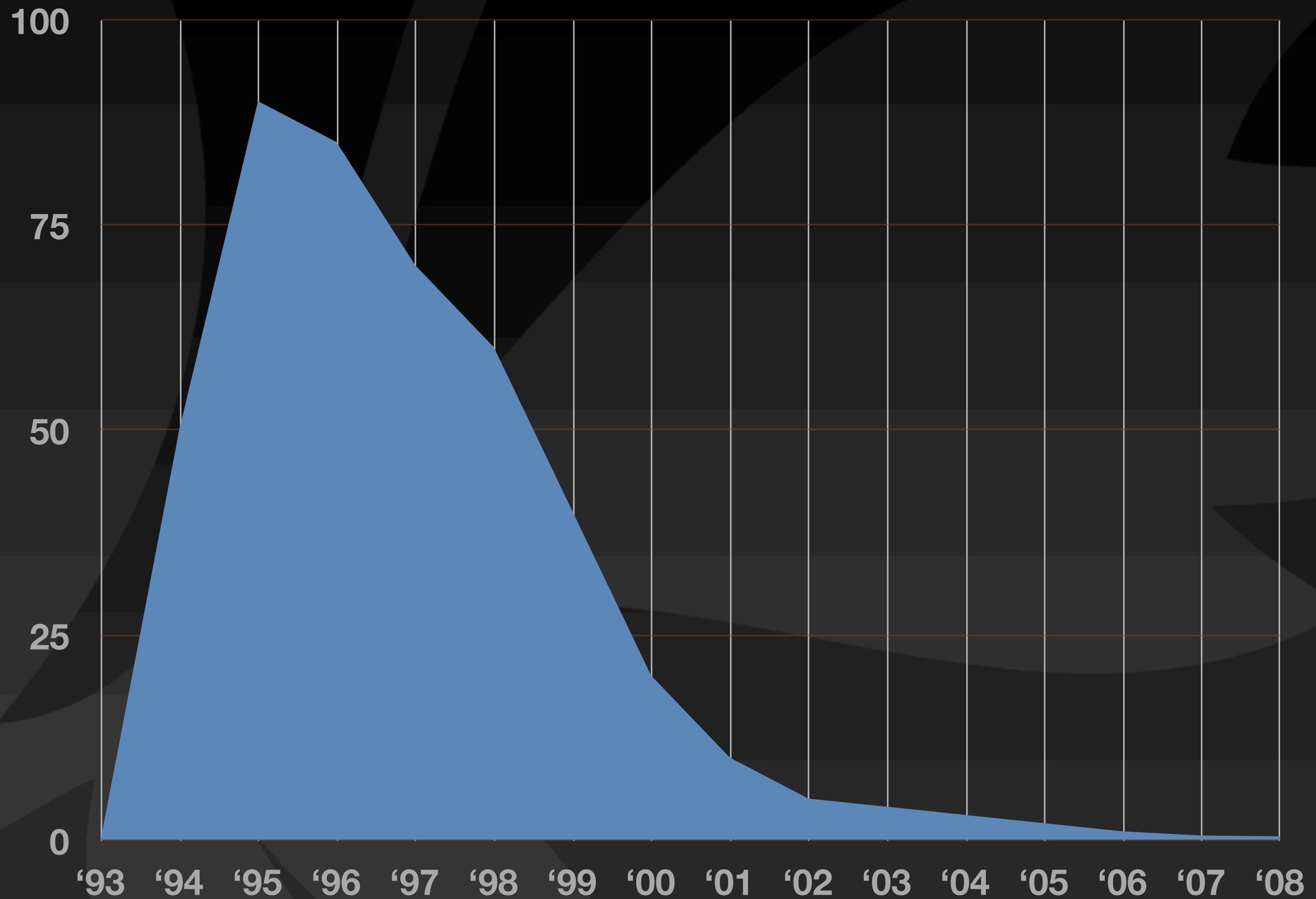

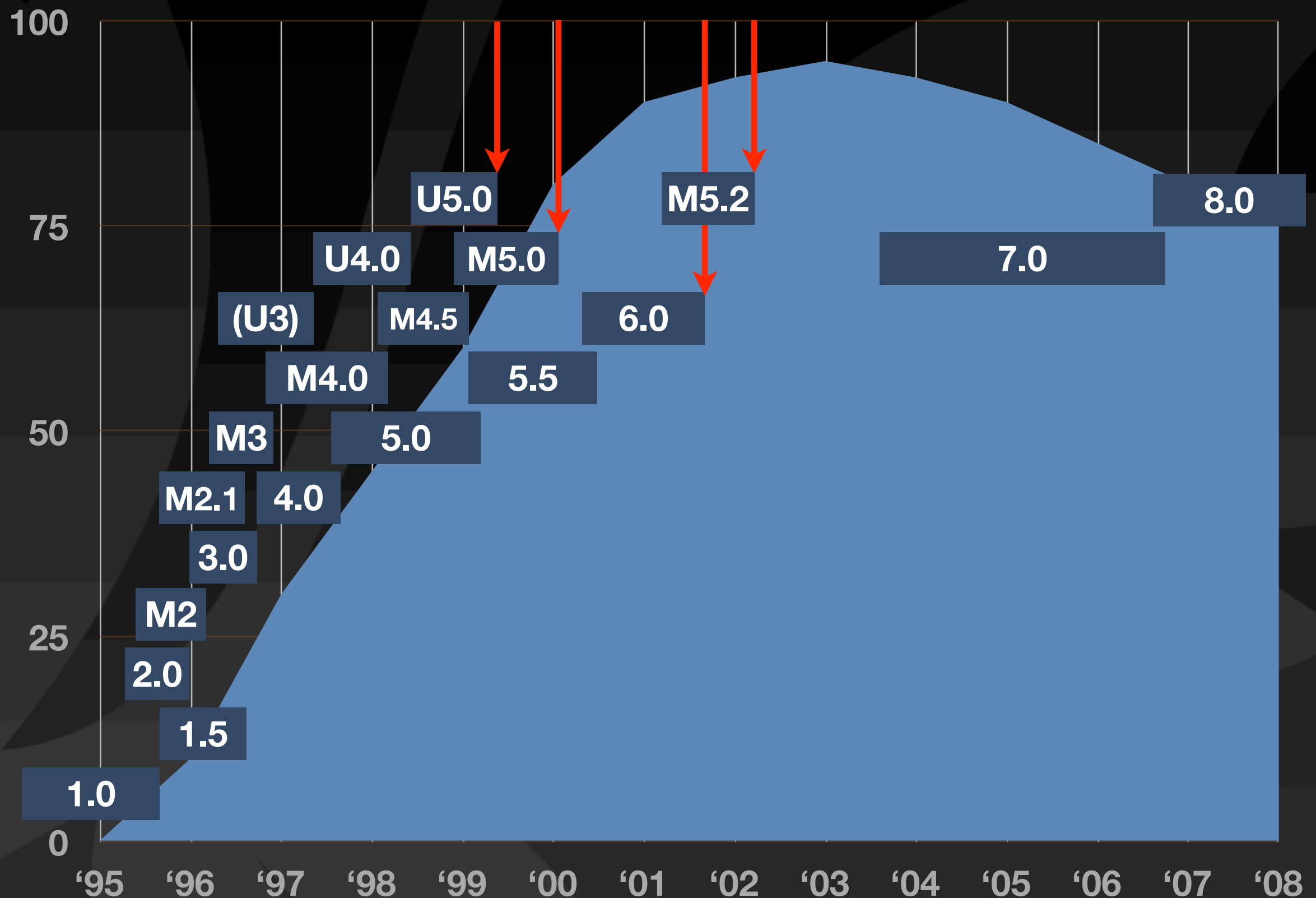

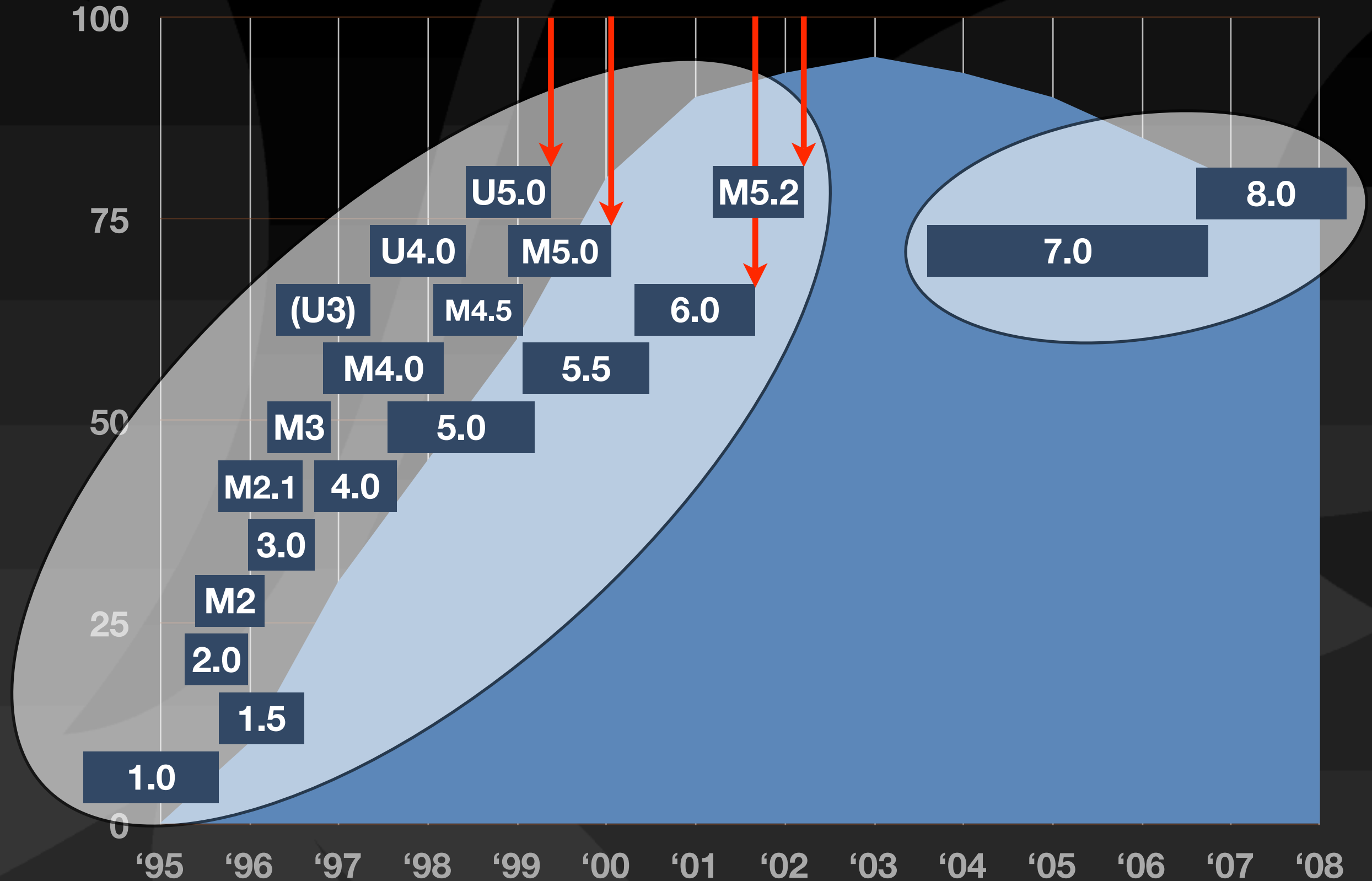
Netscape Usage Share
