


- → Ubiquitous adoption of Apache Open Source Projects;

- → 100% available to the public: zero cost and no licensing fees

- → Apache projects are powering more than half the Internet, managing exabytes of data, executing teraflops of operations, and storing billions of objects in virtually every industry.

- → The commercially-friendly and permissive Apache License 2.0 has become an industry standard within the Open Source world.

Why the ASF Works: The Apache Way




Our process is based on three pillars known as "The Apache Way":

- → **Earned Authority** Individuals participate in Apache projects as individuals. They earn merit, and grow the community's trust and appreciation by what they do and how they do it.
- → **Transparency** Our projects are developed and evolved in the open, ensuring that everyone that wants to contribute is able to.
- → **Community** We believe that great software is an emergent property of great communities, and therefore place community health over all else.

- → **Vendor Neutrality** We are a safe, neutral meeting place for competitors to collaborate together on shared goals.
- → **Independence** Our project-focused model of governance lets projects evolve independently, yet ensures they remain free from undue influence and control.
- → **Trust** We are trusted by people and organizations around the globe to serve as a steward for important software projects.
- → **Safety** Our governance model, intellectual property processes and licensing framework provide a safe environment for contributors and users alike.



Foundation Role.



- → Supports 203 TLPs; 335 Apache Projects and their Communities; 48 podlings in the Apache Incubator
- → 24x7x365 support by ASF Infrastructure: nearly 100% uptime
- → Foundation-level support across Trademarks & Brand Management; Legal Affairs; Fundraising; Marketing & Publicity; Accounting & Administration
- → Community Education/Outreach/Engagement: ApacheCon, Apache Community Development
- → ASF Security Committee: provides oversight, perspective, advice, and metrics; ensures vulnerabilities are properly reported and addressed

Financial Status.



- → Report on budget vs actuals monthly;
- → Consistently operate under budget in terms of expenses;
- → Have annual 5 year projections;
- → Passed first-ever audit in the history of the ASF: "unqualified";
- → More than 9 months of operating cash reserve;
