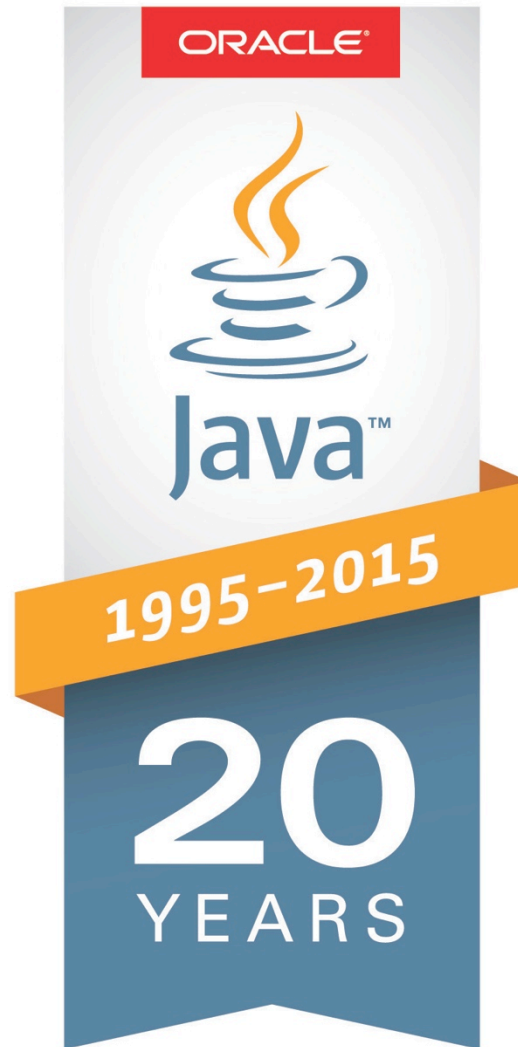

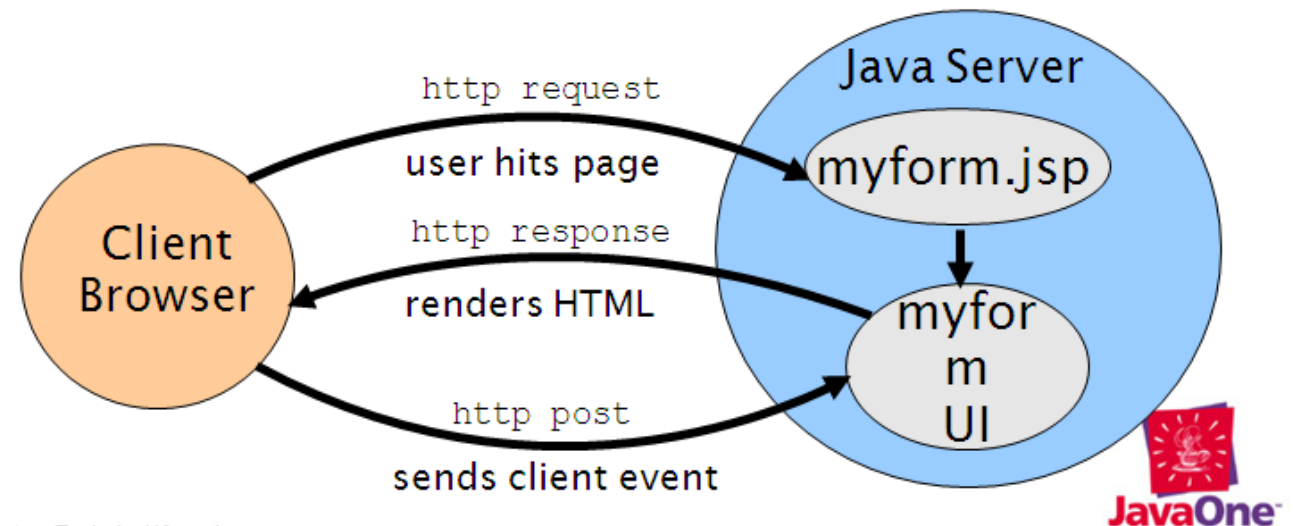


Is JSF Really That Old?

 - Client posts events back to server

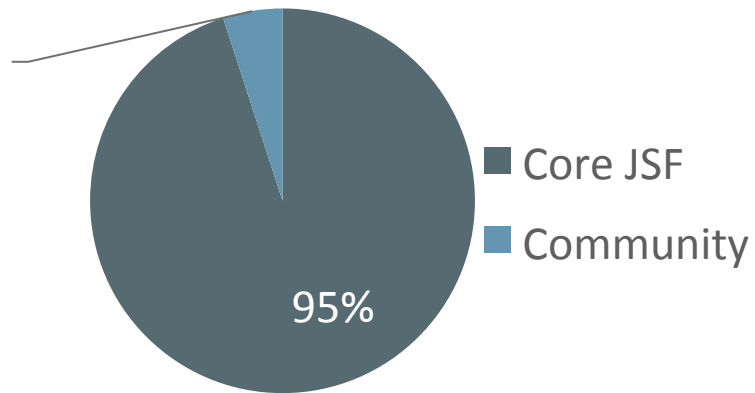

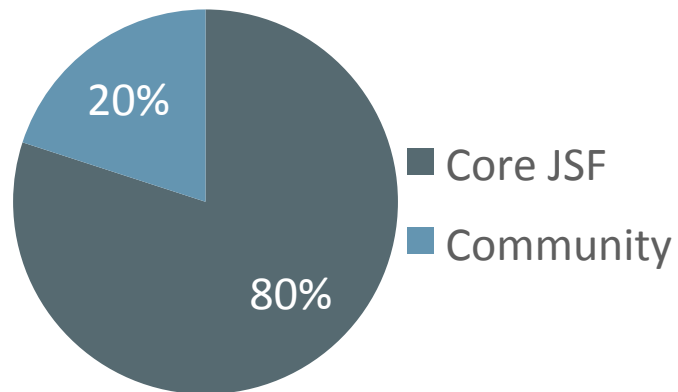
The changing role of JSF over time

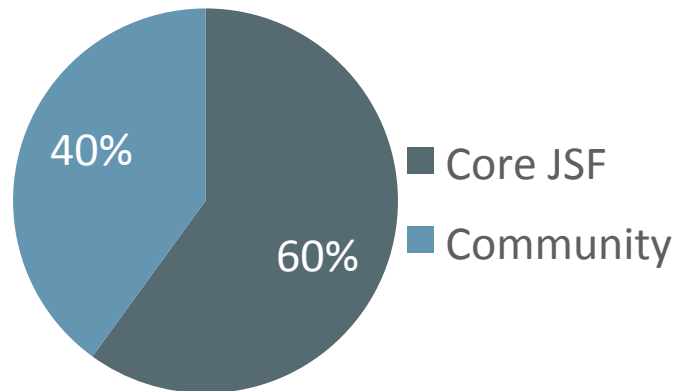
The changing role of JSF over time

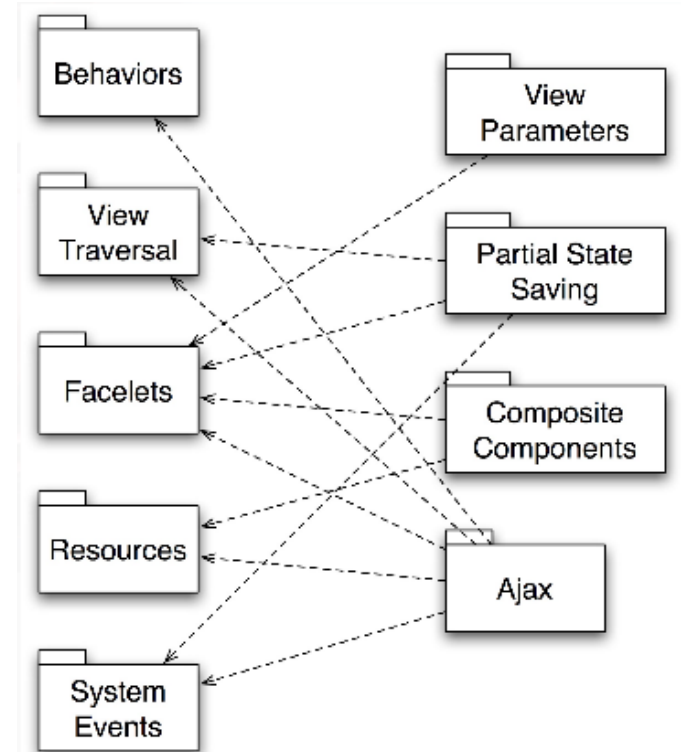

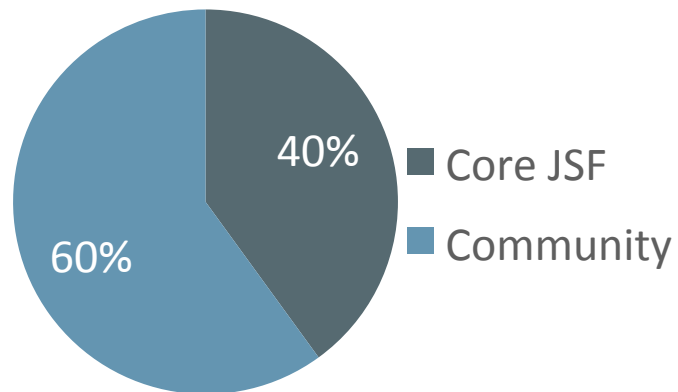

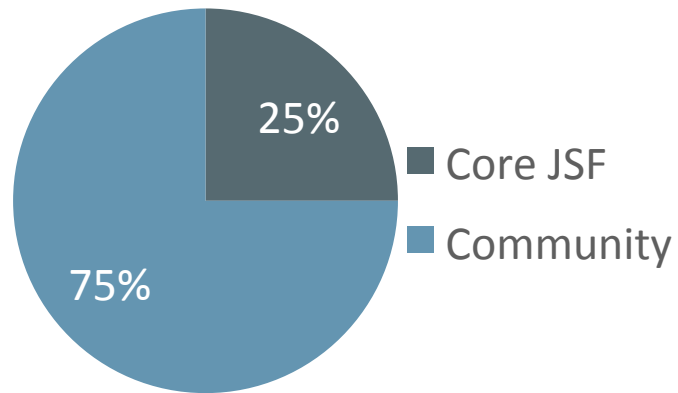

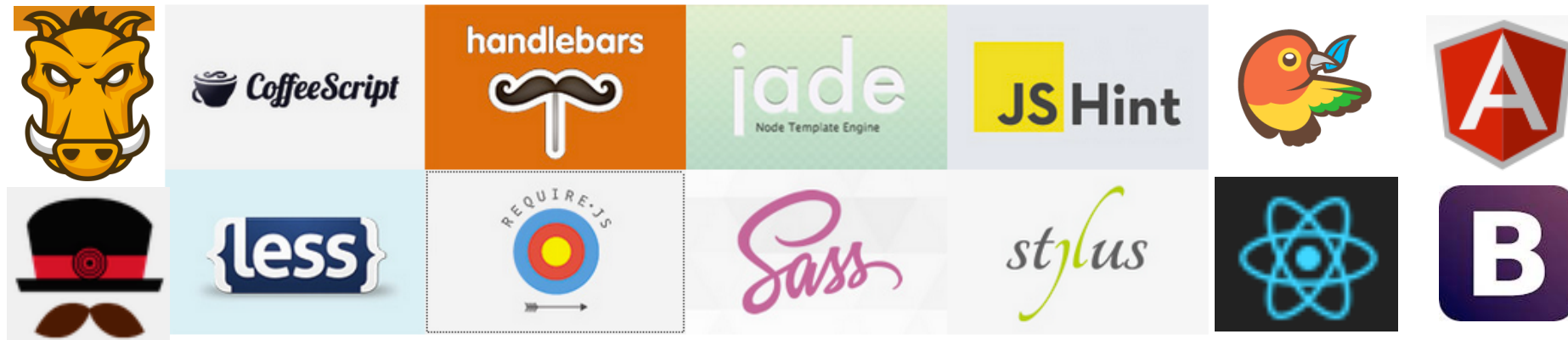

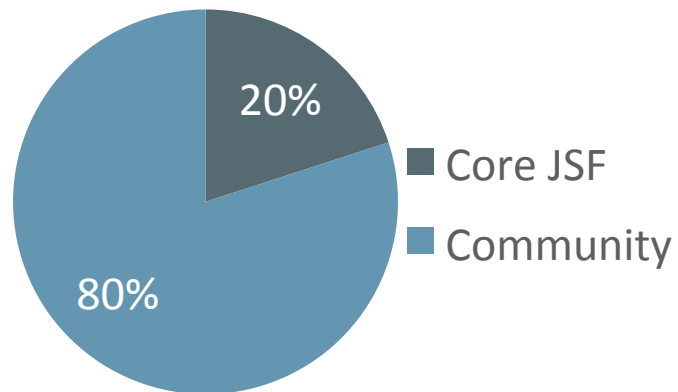

Enablers

- The Java Ecosystem
 - Maven
 - IDEs
- Java EE development style
 - taglibs and descriptors can be read by tools
 - App server concept (containers when containers were not cool)

JSF Ecosystem Highlights

- PrimeFaces – The big one
 - Has everything you could need and lots you might not
- OmniFaces – The JSF library from that guy with 600k StackOverflow points
- BootsFaces – Simpler than PrimeFaces, but still has Twitter Bootstrap
- HighFaces – HighCharts for JSF
- ButterFaces – A different take on Twitter Bootstrap

State of JSF 2.3

- Early Draft Review Just Released!
- Mojarra 2.3.0-m04 Just Released! Runs on GlassFish 4.1.1 (Just Released!)
- Requires Java SE 8

State of JSF 2.3

- Community Driven Release
- Not designed to deliver blockbuster new big features
 - WebSocket integration <f:socket> (not implemented in 2.3.0-m04)
 - Multi-field Validation (issue JAVASERVERFACES_SPEC_PUBLIC-1!)
 - JavaTime support
 - Better CDI integration
 - DataModel implementations can be registered
- 614 issues marked Resolved Fixed since start of JSF 2.3
