 - Linux distribution (RHEL or SuSE)
 - System Software (JVM+)
 - Optional value-added components (HP OpenView) and development environment (Eclipse)
- Run on industry standard servers
 - 32 bit ProLiant servers
 - 64-bit Integrity servers
- Tested, validated and managed by HP
