Java/EE development today

There's \$#0! that wastes your time...

- Many *gotchas* and inconsistencies
- Integration becomes increasingly complex as you work around these issues
- · Fragmented communities of frameworks





Addressing *Gotchas*


Requires:

- · Good education, examples, or abstraction
- · Deprecating old APIs and configurations
- · A centralized community for knowledge sharing

Addressing Fragmentation

Requires:

- · A centralized platform/experience
- · A centralized on-line presence (the app market)
- · Empowered contribution and involvement





So what if we could have:






1. Someone to take care of us, fix the *gotchas* and handle most configuration










2. An abstract, yet consistent process for integrating frameworks


What just happened?

The power of openness





The power of openness

- · Forge is easy to extend
- · Anyone can write and distribute plug-ins
- · Anyone can contribute to modular development





+1 Plugins are cool!!

And can be loaded from:

- Maven
- · Git Repo
- · Local project sources

- · Local JAR file
- · Remote URL JAR file
- · The Forge Search Index





The power of openness

By hosting plugins on Git:

- · You establish trust via transparency
- · You encourage collaboration!
- · You can still be registered in the Forge Search Index!

Why another tool?

- Design for the situation: joining fragmented communities
- · Open-source, standards oriented
- +5 Plugins still cool!!





Why a shell?

- · GUIs are often cumbersome for simple tasks
- Empowers scripting and automation: repeatability/tests
- · De-couple the tooling from the tools





Is this just a Maven wrapper?

- No...
- Maven is used for what it's good at, an excellent dependency management tool
- · Forge's architecture is actually build-system agnostic





Why not use Maven archetypes?

- · Difficult to make "choices"
- Archetype run = archetype done. Forge continues to enhance existing projects
- Much like UNIX-style applications, plug-ins decouple concerns





Forge helps us to:

- · Reduce barrier to entry & repetitive tasks
- · Smooth out configuration woes
- Integrate with existing tools / technologies
