Study the template.xsl

- If you look closely at the **template.xml** file from the last example, you will notice that you have a combination of XSL and HTML code intermixed in the file.
- Entries look like:

```
<xsl:value-of disable-output-escaping="yes"
select="root/dynamic-element[@name='my-
title']/dynamic-content"/>
```

do an XSL lookup in the Article for the entry that corresponds to the Structure's "my-title" element.

- Though slightly complicated, XSL is a very powerful language.

Barcelona vs. Real Madrid





The capital of Catalonia vs. The capital of Spain meet at least twice a year in 'El Clasico'. Catalonia is a region in the east of Spain which feels independent and one of the ways in which it expresses that is through it's football club FC Barcelona. Barcelona as well as Real Madrid thought to have signed the star player. In the end The Spanish FA decided that both teams should share the player on every-other-season basis. Barca refused this and Di Stefano became part of one of the most succesful club sides of all time.

For the people in Barcelona this was another example of the injustice they had to suffer from the central government in Madrid.
