
Noun:

1: A period of time in history, typically one marked by notable events or particular characteristics.


2: The beginning of a distinctive period in the history of someone or something.

The 3rd Epoch: Software Defined Networking



- Virtualized networks
- Network Services in the virtualized domain
- Programmable
 Networks
- Software Ecosystem driving innovation
- Configuration
 Automation
- Much lower OpEx
- Workload Mobility, geographically independent



But ...

- Established Vendors are dialed into these requirements
- May offer programmable Layer 2/3 networks
- Address 80% of requirements
- · Architecture shifts take time to materialize
- Slowing Down SDN
