1.2 General Features

- Browser sessions no longer expire: set logout time to 0 in global.properties to get never expiring pages.
- Teamwork has a new start-up system
- Nicer assignment editor

1.3 Bug fixes

- More robust error reporting system
- Assignments: selecting resources and roles with mouse on Firefox/Mac now works
- Remote file disabled protocols are really disabled
- Documents with non ASCII names sent to Teamwork by mail are correctly received and named
- Data length verification on issue save

In particular for the online service:

- More robust lookup pages (task groups etc.)

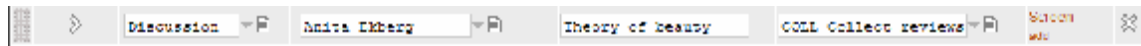

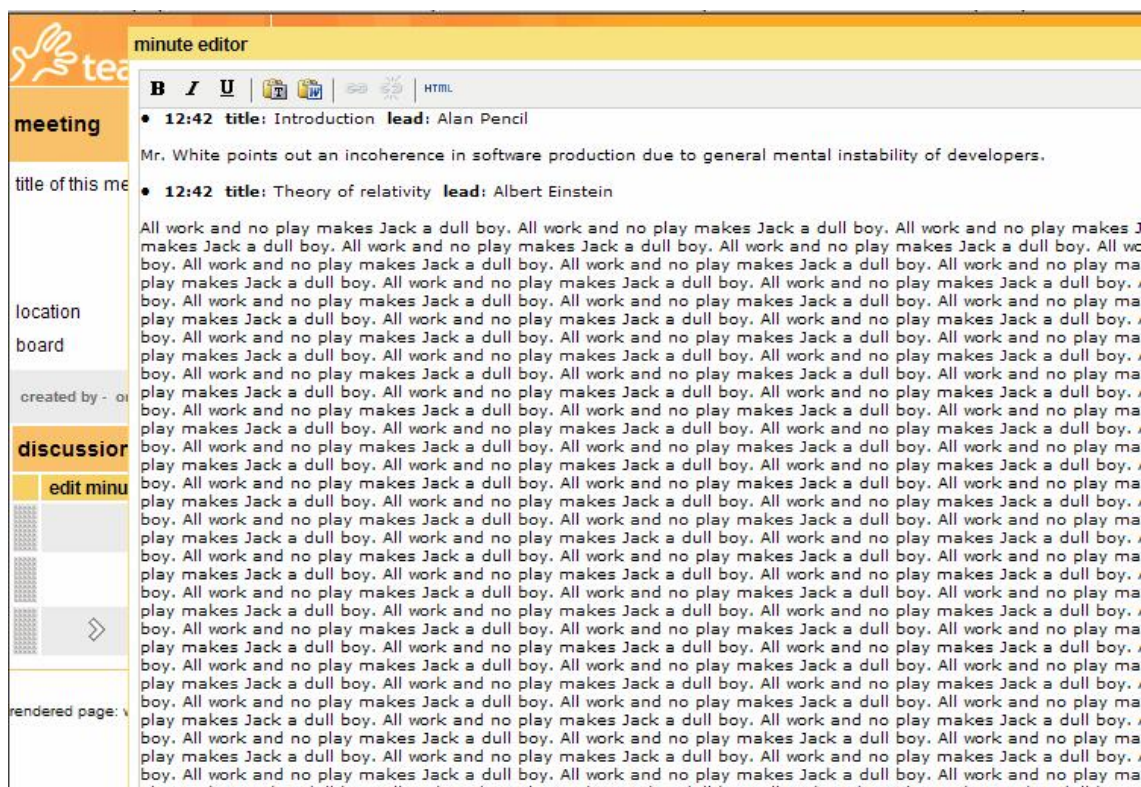

Each meeting is structured in discussion points:




where only titles are mandatory.

The module facilitates recording of meeting minute, by inserting dynamically discussion point contents in it:




Notice that the minute can be of any length.

1.5 Systemic and developers news

Releases are tested also on Debian Linux systems.

Installer activates UTF-8 encoding by default.

Ajax calls are always UTF-8 encoded.

Clearer error messages on Tomcat.

Note: We found out that Tomcat by default does not correctly encode URLs: in order to get correct encodings, you must set

```
URIEncoding="UTF-8"
```

In the connector configuration for example:
